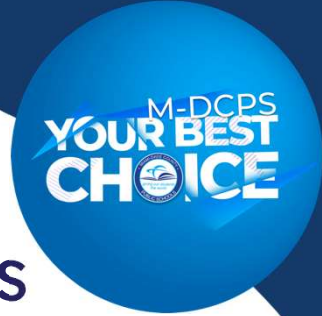

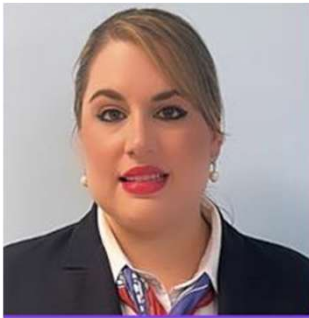

- It is designed to provide students with additional help in Reading, Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies.
- The main objective is to support schools and districts to ensure that high quality education is equitable for all students.
- The Title I Schoolwide Program is committed to helping schools close the achievement gap between disadvantaged and minority students and their peers.

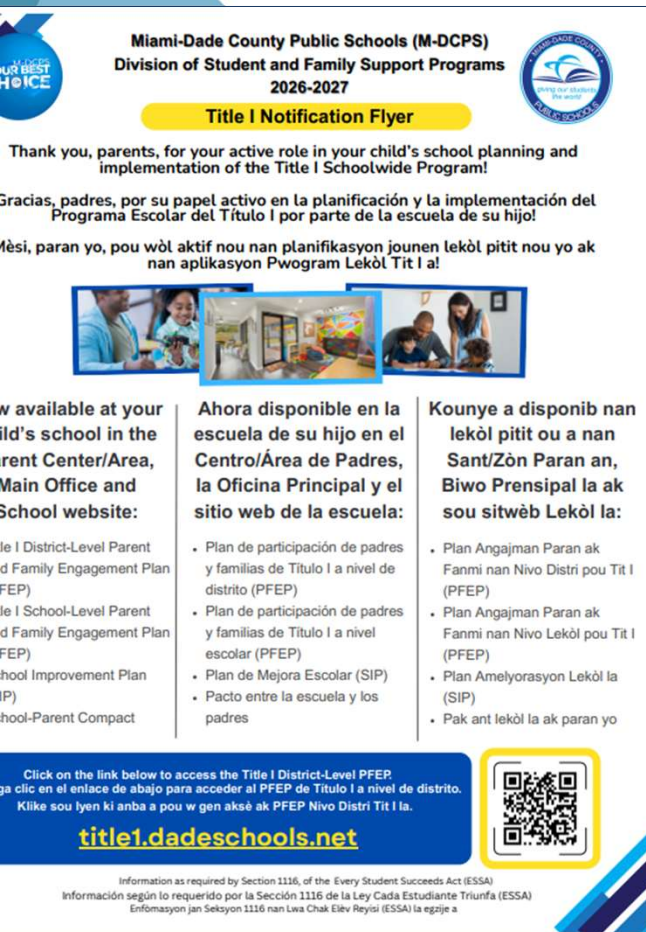
All About Title I (Cont'd.)

How does the ESSA and the Title I Parent and Family Engagement requirements help parents and families?

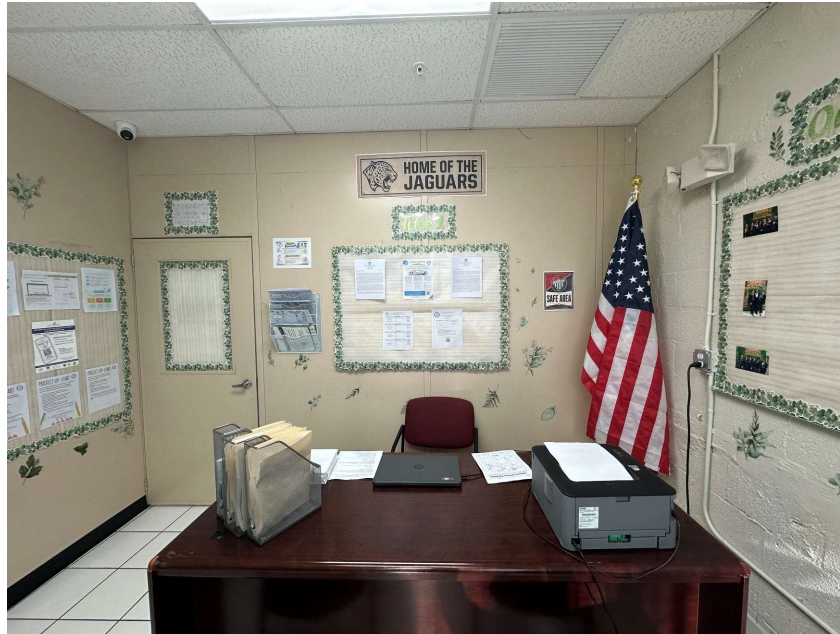

The school accomplishes this via parent-conferences, providing workshops, sending progress reports and report cards, individualized learning plans, and parent surveys and feedback opportunities.
- Provide training to assist parents and families of students enrolled in schools implementing the Title I Schoolwide Program to improve academic achievement. The school accomplishes this task via orientation sessions, trainings on academic programs and assessments, parent-teacher conferences, and participation in parent advisory councils.

Parents, Families and Schools Working Together

- What does school and parent collaboration look like?
 - Our school fosters collaboration with families by offering activities, training sessions, workshops, and parent-teacher conferences at flexible meeting times. The school will conduct monthly meetings/workshops in the mornings from 9:30am-10:30am and in the afternoons from 3:45pm-4:45pm every month. Phone calls and flyers and phone calls will be We also provide a Parent Resource Center/Area to support family engagement.
 - School and parent partnerships are strengthened through participation in advisory councils such as the Educational Excellence School Advisory Council (EESAC), the Title I District Advisory Council (DAC), and the Charter Schools Parent Advisory Council (PAC).

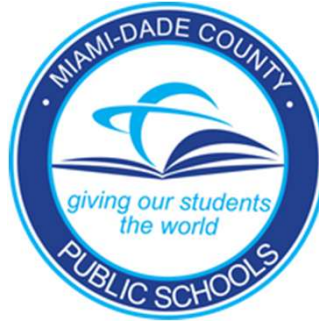
